CARMEL VALLEY'S OWN WINS NOVICE TROPHY AT NATIONAL SHOW

At the California Federation of Mineralogical Societies Annual Show & Convention, folks can enter displays into competition in one of three levels: Novice (for folks who have never competed before), Advanced (for folks who may have competed once or twice but still aren't sure they're fully up-to-par for the "big leagues"), and Masters (for folks with impressive full-fledged collections or finely honed lapidary and jewelry-making skills). If your display wins in its particular division and class at either the Advanced or Masters level, you get publicly acknowledged and recognized at the Awards Banquet and you earn a nice plaque as a trophy along with a ribbon. Not so at the Novice level!

A few years ago, Diane Cook (the current President of the Ventura Gem & Mineral Society, or VGMS) entered competition for the very first time as a Novice. Even though she was awarded a perfect score, she was subsequently disappointed when she attended the Awards Banquet, and not a single person entering at the Novice level was even mentioned. On top of that, there was no plaque—just a little ribbon that was taped onto her display case and that was stolen over the course of the show—and that the Awards committee at first refused to replace for her! Rather than get mad at the CFMS Rules Committee that administers these competitions, Diane decided to get even—in the nicest of ways. Thus, starting at last year's Federation Show, at Diane's initiative, VGMS officially sponsored and paid for a Novice Trophy to be publicly awarded at the Awards Banquet so that first-time exhibitors would not be left out of the festivities.

This year, VGMS served as host to the combined California and American Federation of Mineralogical Societies Show & Convention at the Ventura County Fairgrounds on June 9-11. Among those who entered competitive exhibits at this national show was Carmel Valley's very own Susie Harlow. As this was her first time entering competition, she entered at the Novice level with an educational display celebrating her father's fabulous benitoite discoveries from the 1930s. I'm pleased to report we were honored to see Susie step forward at the Awards Banquet to receive the VGMS Novice Trophy. Congratulations and well done, Susie!

TRIP REPORT: Matt & Barb Biewer

Barb and I went to Arkansas in May and early June. We did the zip line over the mine pit two times in the morning and two more times in the afternoon. CARMEL VALLEY'S JIM BRACE-THOMPSON HONORED BY AFMS AT NATIONAL SHOW

Although Jim and Nancy Brace-Thompson left the Monterey area and moved to Ventura nearly 20 years ago, they have remained CVGMS members and continue to come and participate each year at our annual club show. Up until the move to Ventura, Jim had served several years as CVGMS President, and he was on the Show Committee when CVGMS served as host to the CFMS Show & Convention in 1998. At that convention, he was asked if he would take on the Junior Activities Chair for the California Federation. He did so, and it proved to be the first step in a long and interesting journey. Along the way, he became Juniors Program



chair for the American Federation and started a badge program for junior rockhounds—a program that he's been administering for 14 years now, updating and publishing four editions of the Badge Manual. The program has reached well over 4,000 kids over the years. He's also served as the elected President of the California Federation and has received such honors as the California Federation Golden Bear Award in recognition of outstanding lifetime service to CFMS, and in 2014 he was inducted into the National Rockhound & Lapidary Hall of Fame in their Education category, primarily for his work with the badge program. This year, Jim obtained a final feather in his cap when—at the CFMS-AFMS National Show & Convention in Ventura—he was awarded the AFMS Recognition Award for Outstanding Service to AFMS and to the Hobby. Apparently—when it comes to rocks as a hobby—Jim now has nothing further to live for. As of the last report, we hear he's moving on to stamp collecting...

We have been doing this for some time and have received unbelievable amounts and kinds of rocks from all over the country. Gemmers have commended us on our selections. I am sure you will like these "gems".

Should you decided to exchange rocks with us, it will be like Christmas all over and the only time the rocks come to us instead of us going to the rocks.
